Explanation of schedule and other notes

This is for an all-day event. We really recommend only going until 2:00 but if you would like to go to 4:00 we wanted to make sure you had a schedule.

We color code every group so that way everyone will know where they are supposed to be at all times. As you look at the schedule you will notice the three groups are all different colors. That corresponds to the color on the name tags for both workers and children. For a volunteer not working with a particular class but one that is in charge of registration, food, games or playground, they will wear a 4th color. The volunteers in the class will take breaks when they take them to the different “centers” (food, playground, games). When the volunteer drops them off at the center, they will drop off the clipboard with every child’s name and then the center person will be in charge. We recommend having 2 floaters to go around and make sure everyone is ok and doesn’t need anything. Usually, the person in charge should be a floater so they can be easily found if there are questions.

For snacks, I recommend talking to your local grocery store. Also, for lunch we’ve had pizzas donated to us every year for the students.

When the students go into the Africa part of the Read-a-thon, the teachers for that class need to stay with the class. In case a child needs something, we want to avoid distraction for everyone and we don’t want to put that on the presenter.

We tried to keep the paperwork as simple as possible and mostly black and white as that will help you save money when printing.

Please use these as written or as a guideline. You are welcome to change these up to help your cause. For example, if you aren’t doing a project for Uganda but something else you will need to change up the forms to talk about your project. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

The participant check in page is for the teachers to have info about each child. We place the papers on a clipboard and then send the floater to the room with the group to give to the teacher and the teacher will keep this paper on a clipboard and keep it with them the entire time, unless they have been given to a “center.” We’ll usually highlight the

From One Child to Another to match the group to make it easy to identify each group during registration. Once registration in the morning is over (kids will come throughout the day but most kids will arrive at the beginning of the day. Throughout the day as kids arrive, the floater can walk them to their class and can take information to the teacher for them to write on their papers.
